

#### **Sweet Potato Custard**

#### Ingredients:

#### **Filling**

2 cups mashed (cooked) sweet potatoes ½ cup light corn syrup I large can evaporated milk 2 tsp. Lemon extract I tsp. Salt 2 whole eggs beaten

#### Directions:

Mix the filling ingredients.

Pour into a 9 in. fluted pie shell.

Bake at 425 Degrees for 15 minutes.

Lower oven to 350 Degrees and bake until center is set.

#### Hints:

You may substitute Splenda for the corn syrup. I have used 4 eggs instead of 2 and liked the result.


Region/ Chapter activities and events.



- 7. Conformity to the above rules at the discretion of the Newsletter Editor.


