.Potential Scam Notice: USclassified4all.com

Recently John Lester advertised his 1967 Oldsmobile 442 convertible on Hemmings, and a few other sites.

The site listed above then carried an advertisement for his car at a greatly reduced price, The photographs were stolen from, as John stated, the Hemmings site.

He has contacted them via email telling them that their ad is fraudulent. As on Saturday, September 17th he has had no response and the ad is still up.

I went to the site this morning and it was still there. I looked over numerous ads, and noticed that the wording on more than ten was exactly the same as the ad in question. It is apparent that the ad is false.

What can be done about this type of thievery?

1. If you are going to list your car for sale on several classified sites, use different views of the car for each site. Shot from different angles etc.

This will make it so you can

track the car if a false ad shows up. Then hold the classified company accountable.

This kind of situation is very hard to track. The companies that advertise should use a better spyware or security format to protect themselves and their advertisers. But sadly, they don't. Can we stop it? Probably not.

November 6th is our Chilli cookout and auction to be held at Don and Pam Pumphreys home. See article in newsletter.


The meeting was adjourned at 7:41 pm.

The SGCCC folks made us feel right at home and were very generous. A great bunch of folks to get to know. I asked them to forward any events they are hosting and agreed to do the same,


